The countdown to Teens Camp has begun.

Pete officially takes the reins as the assistant-camp director and has been busy organising application forms, putting together Bible lessons and recruiting and training staff to be leaders (counsellors). With only a couple of weeks to go, the camp committee are finalising numbers, hoping to have around 60 campers with a team of 15 leaders. Each camp is assigned a camp director and an assistant – Pete's learning how it's done here. Most of his future work will be 'big picture' stuff, like training leaders for camp ministry and disciple making.

In addition to organising Teens Camp, Pete has been involved in a couple of Forma' Camp reunions (which happen monthly) and visiting some of the Forma' campers to catch up and see how and where they are plugged into their local churches.

One of Pete's biggest challenges is coming up with ways to make the camping ministry self-sustaining, and encouraging the church in Rwanda to take ownership of the ministry. To date camps have run on the generosity of supporters in Europe. It costs about 40,000 Rwandan Francs (AU\$76) per person to run a 9 day camp, but for most of the campers and leaders, this amount is unattainable. Fees are set at 8 000Rwf (\$15) or for some, whatever they can afford, with the shortfall coming from donations. It's very much an act of faith — organising every camp not knowing where the funds will come from, but God has been, and continues to be faithful. Please pray for wisdom for Pete and the camp committee as they wade through these issues.
