We feel incredibly privileged to have homes in many different places, to have built on, and made new memories with so many people in so many places over the last few months. While we certainly didn't have a holiday, or very much rest while in Australia, we've returned to our Rwandan home feeling refreshed and renewed and ready to settle back into life in this place.

Our final bed count was 22, and we travelled just over 13 500 kilometres (8 400 miles) in order to catch up with everyone. As much as we enjoyed it, we were all ready and glad to be back in our own beds and our own space, and for a while the 10k trek across town to go swimming, or into the city, will do us!

The next couple of months should be fairly quiet. The kids will continue with school work – catching up on what we didn't finish; but it also helps to fill long days with limited options for entertainment. Pete will reconnect with his small Bible study group and begin some of the preparations for camp. Catherine will begin language study and start to get organised to begin two Play Therapy programmes in August – one at KICS (the kids' school), the other with Live Again Rwanda, a small counselling service and training organisation. Because camp has been moved to August (due to the upcoming elections), we are excited about the opportunity to go to an annual conference for missionaries that has been taking place in Rwanda for the last 70-odd years. We are looking forward to the opportunity to meet some more of the mission community here, and to enjoy some retreat time.
