FAQ...

~ How is your support raising going?

It's getting there, building slowly, but we still have a long way to go[.] With less than a month until our deadline (7th November) for having 100% of our budget raised or pledged, we are clinging on to God & trusting in His provision.

To date our budget sits at about 30% of what we need, while our prayer support team is much closer to being complete (though really, is it possible to have too much prayer?!).

Just to add a bit more pressure into the mix, we also need to raise funds for a vehicle in Rwanda. Honestly, we aren't sure how to go about this. It's hard enough asking for support just to live, without adding the substantial cost for a vehicle, but it's just not practical to try and survive, or for Pete to get to camp & do all the follow-up & mentoring after camp, without a vehicle. It's vital that we get a good quality & as near new as possible vehicle – experience has proven that older vehicles become black-holes that cost more in the long run to maintain – but this means that we have to pay more initially. Also, all vehicles are imported into Rwanda & therefore purchase costs are high. After consulting with the AIM Rwanda team, we are estimating that we are going to need about \$30 000 for a second hand 4WD.

Our priority at this point is our monthly budget so that we can get the green light to go, car fundraising can be an ongoing effort. However, if you have a desire to donate to our vehicle fund we would appreciate it (any donations need to be clearly marked as 'Gitau car'). Equally we'd love fundraising ideas or leads on low or no interest loans! We would also ask that if you are planning on supporting us financially or prayerfully but have yet to send in a form, it would help us immensely if you could send it in ASAP – even if your commencement for financial support is not until next year, it will add to our total.
