## FAQ...

#### ~ Now you're at 100% what happens?

Having 100% support means that we are able to travel with the peace of mind of knowing that we have the full budget needed to set-up a home & cover the day-to-day costs of living in Rwanda· Our support won't start being paid until we arrive in Kenya for orientation· Even though our support is at 100%, we can continue to accept contributions, which will accrue in our AIM account· This will help if people need to stop supporting us due to changed circumstances & will also give us an additional buffer for currency fluctuations· People may also prefer to redirect new giving to our vehicle fund (see below)· Being made redundant is not something that I (Catherine) would have thought I could say I'm grateful for, but that is what has paid for this trip to visit family, supporters & friends in the US & Germany· The trip to Switzerland is to meet & talk with the couple who started the camp in Rwanda, it is such an exciting & valuable opportunity·

#### ~ Do you have a place to live in Rwanda yet?

Not yet, but our team in Rwanda are looking for a place for us. We've decided to try & house-sit for the first few months while we complete Inbound Orientation, so that we can work out which part of town will suit us best & exactly what we need in a house.

#### ~ What's happening about a vehicle?

Getting a vehicle is important, & after consulting with the team, not something that we can put off for long after our arrival. We've heard about a vehicle that is available & seems suitable, but we are waiting to get more details & may even wait until we get to Rwanda to see it before we make a final decision. It will cost US\$20 000, plus anything needed for servicing/replacement parts. Financial contributions can be made toward a vehicle fund for us, & will be gratefully received – they can be sent through AIM but need to be designated as "Gitau vehicle fund".

Please pray for wisdom for us as we make these big decisions about a new home and a vehicle.
