The COVID19 edition...

It turns out that even Rwanda isn't immune from the COVID19 pandemic. The first case in-country was confirmed Saturday a week ago (14th). The general feeling in the community was that the government would take some fairly swift measures to contain the spread of the virus, and sure enough, within hours, churches,

schools, conferences, sporting events and large meetings were cancelled and people were being encouraged to practice social distancing. On March 20th all flights in and out of Rwanda were suspended for 30 days, and last night we were informed that we are now under full augrantine.


What does that mean for us?

For at least the next 2 weeks all non-essential movement outside of our home is not permitted. In practical terms, that means we can go for food supplies or medical treatment if needed, but that's it.

On Saturday (21st) we had 17 confirmed cases of COVID19 incountry, all but one are people who have travelled into Rwanda from elsewhere. If we respect the quarantine, the chances of us contracting the virus are minimal. Given the high numbers of people in Rwanda who are considered at risk due to HIV infection, diabetes, and lowered immune systems that are a result of poor nutrition and

limited access to clean water, we are so glad the government has taken such a hard stance in order to keep the people of Rwanda safe. We pray for the protection of Rwanda.

While it's hard not to worry at least a little, we trust God in this, we will follow the direction to stay at home and we are confident we will be ok. We have about 3 weeks to a month's supply of food; we can renew internet, electricity and pay for water with mobile money from home. We'll continue to juggle the kids' school from home, as well as our own study, and so life will go on as normally as possible.



Even we were not immune from the toilet paper purchasing that has taken the world by storm!

Frequently asked questions

What will happen with camp?

At this stage we are planning to run Forma' Camp in July as usual; however it will completely depend on the situation with COVID19 and whether government restrictions have been lifted.

Unfortunately the hoped-for Easter Camp has been cancelled and another group that was hiring the campsite has also cancelled (meaning we lose valuable income for future camps).
